


#### **COVID TESTING**

#### **EQUIPMENT**

Students will need to have the standard equipment we expect from their first day back in the academy. Please can you ensure that this is in place.

As a reminder, here is the list to the equipment that will be needed:

- black pens
- pencils
- a ruler
- red pens for completing self-assessment
- blue pens for completing peer assessment
- a calculator
- their iPad, which needs to be fully charged
- if students have PE on their return date, they must remember their PE kit

Please can we remind you that if a student has PE during period 1 or 2 they should arrive at the academy in their PE kit. They are expected to return to full academy uniform after their PE lesson. If they have PE during period 3, they are permitted to go home in their PE kit.

Students' equipment will be checked daily by their tutor.

#### **ROUTINES**

#### HAND WASHING

We have had lots of new routines put in place since September. These have been in place to keep everyone safe.

Hand washing regularly is proven to reduce the spread of Covid 19. We will asking students to sanitise and wash their hand regularly. This includes as they enter and leave classrooms.

### MOVEMENT AROUND THE BUILDING

### THE YEAR GROUP BUBBLES

Students will continue to follow the one way system we have in place. Students move down the red stairs and up the blue stairs.

Students will stay within their year group bubble for their timetabled lessons to reduce mixing between year groups. Students studying for their GCSEs and A-Levels can move to specialist areas following the one way system.

#### **EQUIPMENT**

#### UNIFORM

We ask students to bring their own equipment and water bottle to reduce contamination as much as possible.

Students must wear their uniform correctly. More information can be found on the uniform part of our website.

Students must have their standard equipment each morning and this is checked by their tutor.

Uniform is checked daily by all members of academy staff.

#### **ENDING OF ACADEMY DAY**

#### **POSITIVE CASE**

We have a staggered end to our academy day to keep all of our community as safe as possible. Parents are reminded to maintain distance from the academy building.

If a Covid case is confirmed we follow all government guidance and protocols as we did in the Autumn term.



ARMISTACE DAY

#### ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

Parents must not send their child into school if they are displaying symptoms associated with Covid 19. Students with symptoms will need to get a Covid PCR test.

#### The following are symptoms of Covid 19:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- -a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

	FOLLOW UP  As part of our safeguarding role and in line with Department for Education guidance, we will follow up each absence by making calls home, home visits and involving other professionals as needed.  We will involve the Local Authority if this is deemed to be appropriate in order to support all parties.

#### **UNIFORM**

As we always share with you, the vast majority of our students are extremely smart and appreciate why we place high regard on their personal presentation and the way in which they wear their uniform. Skirts and trousers must be tailored as per our uniform policy.

We have a very clear expectation that skirt length needs to be at the knee and we have communicated this expectation to all students and parents/carers earlier this year. Our uniform policy has been ratified by our Governing Body and is widely available on our website for all to see.

Please can you ensure all skirts are to the knee. Body con skirts are not to be worn. The following statement has been taken from the policy in relation to skirts for further clarification:

Skirt: Skirts should be black, knee length and worn with black opaque tights. The hem of the skirt should lie / remain on the knee at all times. Body con skirts are not to be worn.

We monitor uniform on a daily basis and work to ensure our expectations are clear and that all of our students wear their uniform in line with our policy. We appreciate your continued support with this.

#### **Post 16 Expectations:**

At the beginning of each academic year every student in Year 12 and 13 will receive a letter outlining their sixth form pathway and our expectations including the latest guidance on uniform. A summary is provided below:

Post 16 Students in our academy are expected to wear clothing and accessories which:

- promote a positive and professional image;
- do not create a risk to either the wearer or others in the academy and is appropriate;
- are not likely to be viewed as offensive or revealing,
- does not distract, cause embarrassment or give rise to misunderstanding;
- is absent of any political or otherwise contentious slogans;
- is not considered to be discriminatory;
- Hair should be neat, tidy and well-groomed. Unconventional styles and extreme and unnatural hair colours are not acceptable.
- Jewellery must not be excessive or unconventional, with visible piercings limited to ears. Single nose studs may be worn for reasons of religious observance only

#### **UNIFORM LOWER SCHOOL YEARS 7—11**

#### SKIRTS

# Skirts should be black, knee length and worn with black opaque tights. The hem of the skirt should lie / remain on the knee at all times. Body con skirts are not to be worn.

#### **SHIRT**

Plain white shirt with collar (not fitted, tailored or blouses). Both long sleeved and short-sleeved are acceptable. No logos are allowed on shirts. Shirts should be worn with all buttons done up and also be tucked in properly to trousers/skirts

#### **TROUSERS**

# Trousers must be straight-legged and be plain black material only, i.e. no tapering (getting thinner) or flaring (widening) towards the ankle. Trousers that are skinny fit/skin tight, denim, made of heavy cotton material, contain Lycra, or similar stretchy / elastic fabric that would cause them to look skin tight/tapered or with logos are not acceptable.

#### **FOOTWEAR**

Formal black shoes only. Sandals, backless shoes, boots, plimsolls, or black trainers are not acceptable

#### **BELTS**

# Plain black only. Belt buckles should be discreet.

#### SOCKS

Plain black socks only. Trainer socks are not permitted

#### COATS

Coats/ other jumpers/scarves are not permitted to be worn in the building during the school day. A black V-Neck jumper can be worn as part of our Covid 19 addendum. No other jumpers are permitted under blazers.

#### TIE

West Lakes Academy year group tie. Ties should be worn with the knot covering the collar button of shirts and a minimum of 4 full stripes should be visible below the knot.

#### **SOCIAL DISTANCING**

#### **FACE MASKS**

We must remain socially distant where we can in order to protect people and prevent infection.

#### **MASKS**

We continue to follow the Department for Education guidance on the wearing of face coverings and masks.

Students are required to wear masks:

- In corridors
- In communal spaces
- In classrooms

This is due to be reviewed at Easter and we will communicate any changes.

We expect students to have their own mask and bring them every day to wear. The masks need to be plain in colour and should have no logo or patterns.

We strongly encourage students to take their masks off when they are outside at break and lunch ensuring that they are keeping socially distant at all times.




# **HOW TO REVISE**

### THE WLA WAY

#### **Use flashcards**







· Questions you couldn't answer correctly - test yourself again tomorrow.

#### Space your revision



Start planning early for exams and set aside a little bit of time every day. Five hours spread out over two weeks is better than five hours all at once. Switch between ideas during a study session. Don't study one idea for too long. Go back over the ideas again in different orders to strengthen your understanding. Make links between different ideas as you switch between them.

### Transform the information



Change a paragraph of text into a diagram, or a diagram into bullet points, or bullet points into a mind map, or ... you get the idea!

#### Explain it



Talk through your work as you do it, explaining your thinking along the way. Tell someone else what you know about the topic. Teach it to them and then test their understanding, helping them if they get stuck.

#### Answer past exam questions



Speaks for itself really. Once you're done, compare your answer to a model answer and then redraft it to make it even better. Hand it in to your teacher to get some further feedback.

#### **Elaborate**



Explain and describe ideas with many details. State a fact and then explain why it is true.

#### Quiz yourself




Test yourself. Get someone else to test you. Use an app like Tassomai to test you.


THINKING MIND MAP MODEL
